



**ACEs Aware is an initiative led by the Office of the California Surgeon General and the Department of Health Care Services to give Medi-Cal providers training, clinical protocols, and payment for screening children and adults for ACEs. Detecting ACEs early and connecting patients to interventions, resources, and other support can improve the health and well-being of individuals and families.**

# What are ACEs

ACES are stressful or traumatic events that children experience by age 18 and are strongly associated with increased health and social risks. Some identified ACEs are abuse, household challenges and neglect. Abuse can be physical or emotional. Household challenges can include parents with mental illness, drug abuse by family members, violence within the house. Neglect can be either physical or emotional.

Through our staff and volunteers, SCMF will provide a multi-tiered referral network of care promoting a trauma informed approach model. Our staff will provide: education, preventative method tools, health presentations, assessments and evaluation sessions, psycho-social individual background data collection, employment and training services, treatment planning, behavioral health/wellness services, food security and ancillary services that include legal support, financial advising, basic skills development, crime prevention, educational services, drug/alcohol/mental health/wellness checkup/screenings and testing for our participants
